

GLOBAL FRIENDSHIP

Since this club was chartered in October 2008, it has been their goal to support our military wherever they could. The military had requested that they provided books, school supplies, sports equipment, clothes and hygiene items for the children of war-torn countries. With troops being pulled out of so many countries, the club looked for a new area of children to serve.

A Redlands Noon Kiwanis member, who lives in the San Diego area (and is now a member of CA's Global Friendship), contacted the club to ask if they could provide assistance to an orphanage in Mexico.

Casa Hoga Cañon Buena Vista is in a very poor area of Mexico. Because there is no running water, it has to be trucked in, costing in excess of \$500 per truckload.

The orphanage houses 30-40 children, ranging in ages from five to 17. New housing rules and regulations were recently implemented to reflect USA standards, causing the children to be moved out of the orphanage until buildings, the grounds, electrical equipment, etc., could be brought up to code.

The final phase of these changes involved buying new mattresses, linens, towels and



pajamas for the children. Each time they thought that it couldn't be done, prayers were answered and they were able to move onto the next phase.

According to Elizabeth Lonergan, who is our liaison and lives most the time in Canon Buena Vista, they have been able to accomplish much of the needed work. Further, she reports that two sisters there have been selected to play on an all-girls Mexican soccer team and will compete in many tournaments. One of the sisters has been selected to matriculate in the engineering program at a local university.

Plans are to establish an English language program and start a vegetable garden and recycling program.

For the past 18 months, CA's Global Friendship Club has provided school supplies, which included 30 backpacks, games, books, sports equipment, hygiene items and food, along with funds for water on a regular basis. At Christmas time, the club's project was to make "candy poppers" for the children. More than 200 candy poppers were sent to the children.

This club is indeed blessed to be able to help these children have a better life.

District Convention (DCON) is the annual event where all Key Club members and advisers from the California-Nevada-Hawaii District come together for education, elections, service, recognition, networking, workshops and more! Redlands High School Key Club president Tim V., along with vice-president Samantha D. and co-advisor Jim O'Neill did much of the heavy lifting and led the club in a fundraiser where they solicited donations from local businesses and organized a drawing to help raise money to fly the 15 key clubbers to Reno. The club also arranged their own airfare and handled much of the club registration responsibilities.

The club was particularly excited to see Cal-Nev-Ha Key Club Governor Angelica Garcia, also from Redlands High School, give her farewell speech at the event.

This is **Laura's** seventh year chaperoning at Key Club District Conventions.
